She will be the estate manager at Domaine Long-Depaquit in Chablis, where her new duties will cover all of the estate's technical activities, from vineyard management through to bottling.

After graduating with a diploma in agricultural engineering from SupAgro in Montpelier, she went on to obtain a graduate diploma in oenology. She rounded her studies off by completing a Masters degree in International Wine and Spirit Trade at the Burgundy School of Business.

Domaine Long-Depaquit, owned by Albert Bichot, is one of the oldest and most renowned estates in Chablis. Its assets consist of 65 exceptional hectares of vines including 10 hectares of Grand Crus and 15 hectares of Premier Crus. Its Chablis Grand Cru "La Moutonne" (2.32 Ha) *monopole* is the pride of the estate. Its vineyards are managed sustainably, even organically for certain plots. At the winery, interventions are kept to a minimum and ageing is conducted with a very restrained use of barrels, in order to encourage the crafting of authentic, mineral, elegant wines.

Albert Bichot, based in Beaune since 1831, is family owned and operated. The House boasts 107 hectares of vineyards divided among 6 exceptional estates located throughout Burgundy: Domaine Long-Depaquit in Chablis, Domaine du Clos Frantin and Château-Gris in Nuits-Saint-Georges, Domaine du Pavillon in Pommard and Domaine Adélie in Mercurey. Albert Bichot is also present in the Beaujolais, at the heart of the Moulin-à-Vent appellation, with Domaine de Rochegrès, named after its prestigious vineyard.

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
