RESULTS OF THE 102nd TASTEVINAGE WINE-TASTING



The 102nd TASTEVINAGE wine-tasting was held on Friday September 28th at the Château du Clos de Vougeot and was chaired by Jasper Morris MW, wine consultant with responsibility for the Hospices de Beaune Wine auction. Out of a total of 485 wines submitted, only 157 will be able to display the TASTEVINAGE brand of approval.

Winegrowers, brokers, restaurateurs, sommeliers, representatives of growers' co-operatives, association presidents, wine industry partners and journalists arranged to meet on Friday last to select, once again, the wines that stood out as authentically representing their appellations and vintages.

For the first time, the jury welcomed into its ranks o enological society presidents from some of France's top educational institutions, including the Haute Ecole de Commerce, the Université Paris-Dauphine, Sciences Po, SupAgro (Paris) and the Ecole Polytechnique - a new and status-enhancing departure, both for these future wine professionals and for the TASTEVINAGE brand.

THE LAUREATES OF THE 102nd TASTEVINAGE

Of the 485 wines the jury of 252 wine judges were required to taste, only 157 were awarded the TASTEVINAGE brand of approval; in other terms, 32.37% of all the wines submitted.
